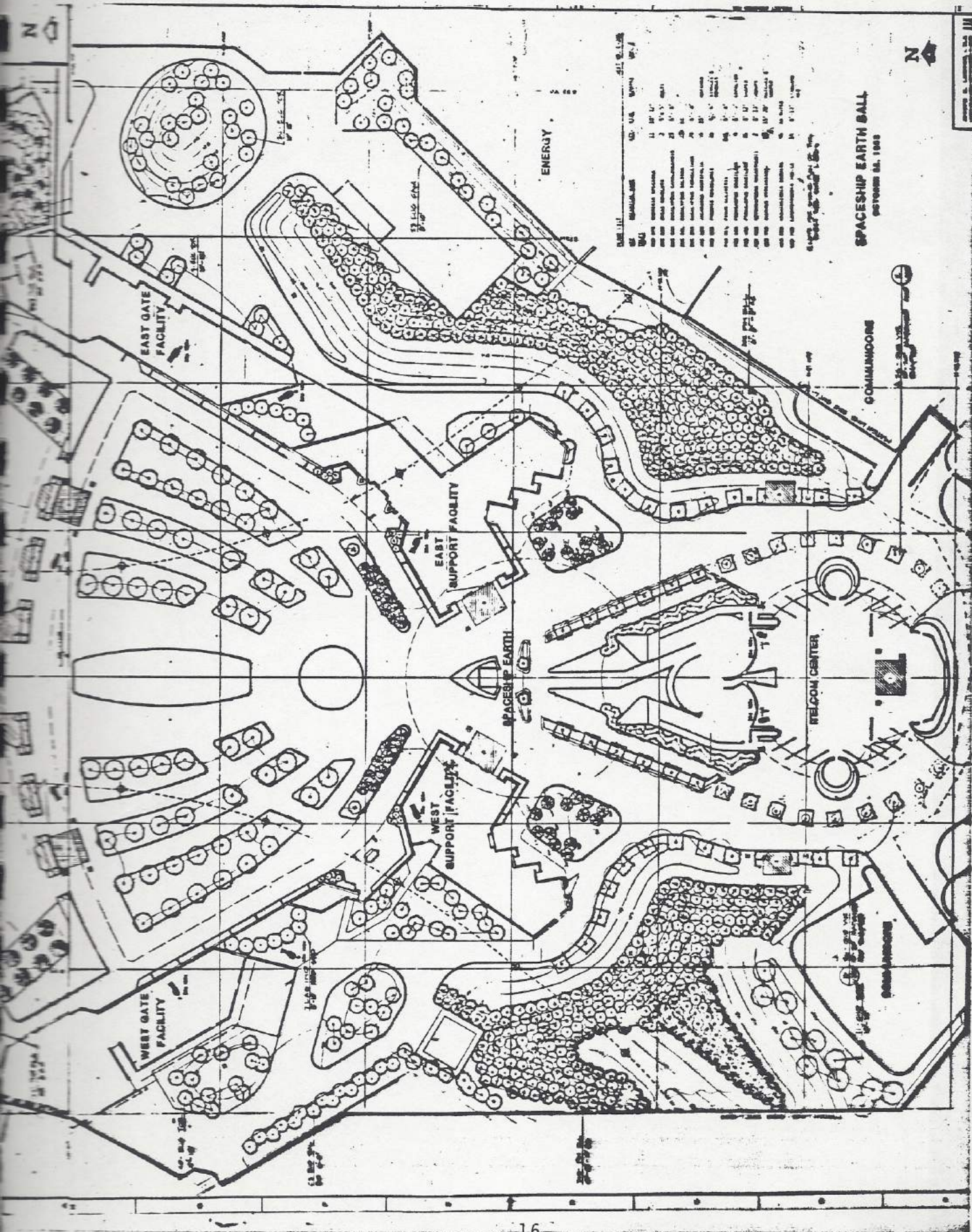

At approximately 10:00 p.m., the All-American College Band will enter the party at American Adventure. It will split and lead our guests to Showcase Plaza. As the Band passes each Pavilion, food and beverage service should cease and attractions and shops will close.

Four International Marching Bands will be parading around World Showcase throughout the evening and pass through performance areas at scheduled break times in those locations. Basic patterns are listed below and detailed schedules appear in the Master Itinerary that follows.

"The Fivoli Boys Guard Band" - assigned primarily to the Denmark site. Marching in the Odyssey Restaurant and moving in formation between Showcase Plaza and the Germany exit road.

"The Boys Band of Newbury" - assigned primarily to Germany. Marching in the Odyssey Restaurant and moving in formation between Showcase Plaza and the Germany exit road.

"The Royal Irish Rangers" - assigned primarily to United Kingdom. Moving in formation from U.K. to Showcase Plaza and back, also from U.K. to American Adventure and back to U.K.

"The Royal Bahamas Police Band" - assigned primarily to Bahamas located between U.S. and Canada. The Band moves in formation completely around the Lagoon area and covers Showcase Plaza several times during the evening.

"The Royal Canadian Mounted Police" - horses are tied up backstage U.S. alongside exit road. Mounted horses are used in rotation (4 to 8 at a time) from approximately 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. providing atmosphere in front of Canada. They parade as a full unit at 9:30 p.m., entering U.S. and progressing clockwise around the Lagoon, exiting U.K. on return. Announcements provide the horses by two zones and appropriate music is played as they enter parading zones along the way.

The International Festival in the Countries of World Showcase

Spectacular pageants of musicians, dance ensembles and Festival groups from nations around the globe. White wine and champagne will be passed along the promenade as guests enjoy the shops, attractions, artisans, food and drink from the World Showcase countries.

International Parading Units

Four International Marching Bands will be parading around World Showcase throughout the evening and pass through performance areas at scheduled break times in those locations. Basic patterns are listed below and detailed schedules appear in the Master Itinerary that follows.

"The Tivoli Boys Guard Band" - assigned primarily to the Denmark site. Breaking in the Odyssey Restaurant and moving in formation between Showcase Plaza and the Germany exit road.

"The Boys Band of Meersburg" - assigned primarily to Germany. Breaking in the Odyssey Restaurant and moving in formation between Showcase Plaza and the Germany exit road.

"The Royal Irish Rangers" - assigned primarily to United Kingdom. Moving in formation from U. K. to Showcase Plaza and back, also from U. K. to American Adventure and back to U. K.

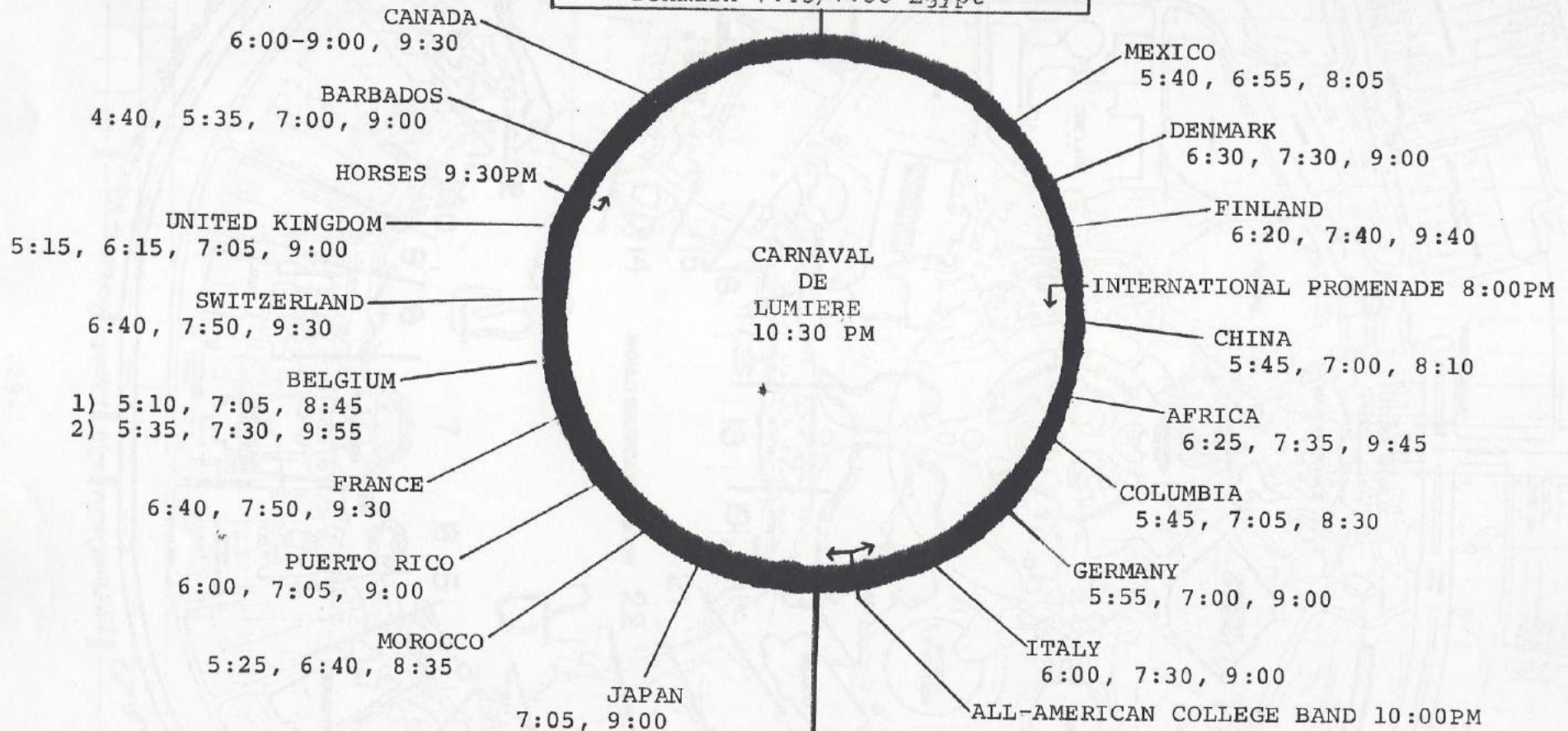
"The Royal Barbados Police Band" - assigned primarily to Zone 15, located between U.K. and Canada. The Band moves in formation completely around the Lagoon area and covers Showcase Plaza several times during the evening.

"The Royal Canadian Mounted Police" - horses are tied up backstage U.K. alongside exit road. Mounted horses are used in rotation (6 to 8 at a time) from approximately 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. providing atmosphere in front of Canada. They parade as a full unit at 9:30 p.m., entering U.K. and progressing clockwise around the Lagoon, exiting U.K. on return. Announcements precede the horses by two zones and appropriate music is played as they enter performing zones along the way.
