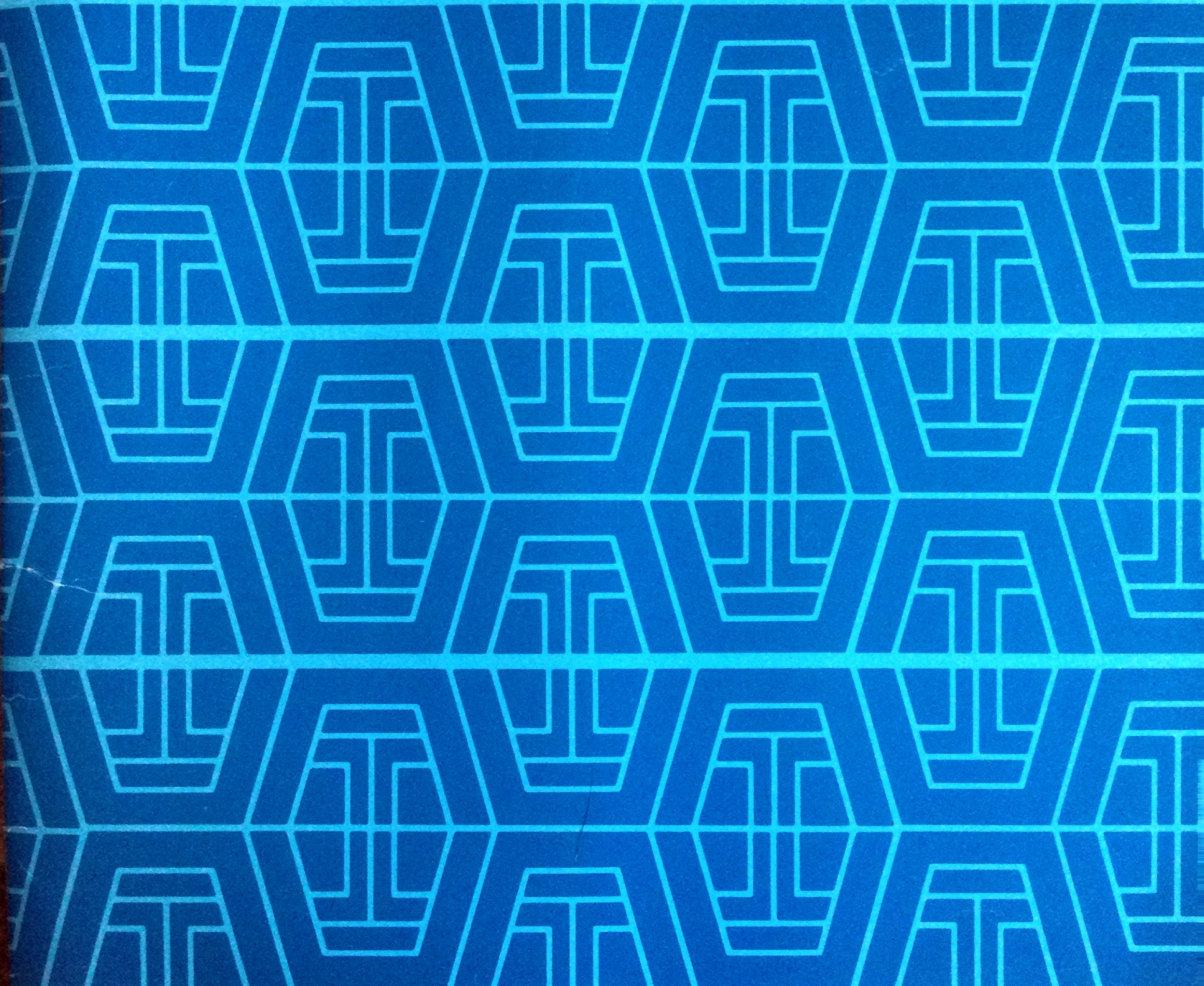
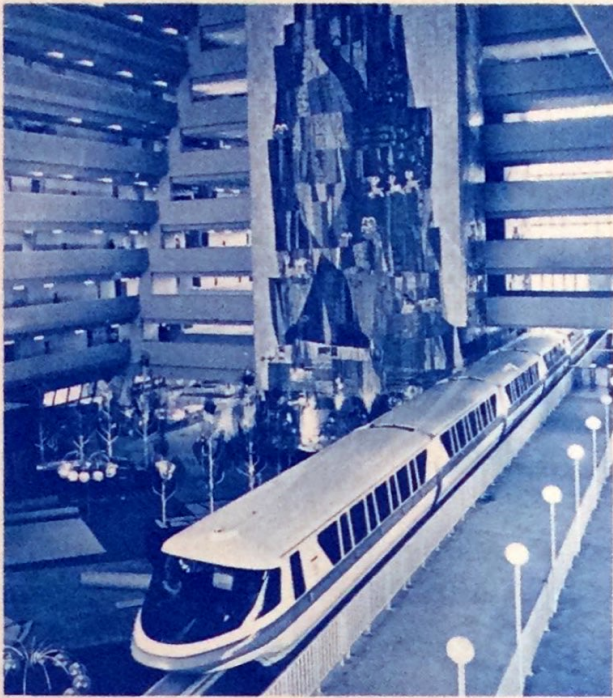

## Contemporary Resort Services

### Identification and Transportation Card

Each member of your party receives an identification card upon check-in. This card entitles you to unlimited use of the Walt Disney World transportation system (monorail, trams, launches, ferryboats, buses) connecting the resort hotels, Fort Wilderness, the Magic Kingdom and the Lake Buena Vista Shopping Village. You may charge purchases in shops, restaurants, lounges, recreational areas and other facilities at the resort hotels, Fort Wilderness, or the Shopping Village. However, the card is not valid in the Magic Kingdom theme park.

### Magic Kingdom Ticket Books

Upon presentation of resort-hotel identification cards, individual family members may purchase special-value ticket books at the Grand Canyon Concourse Monorail Station or at the entrance to the Magic Kingdom.

### Tips on Tipping

It's up to you for service rendered by hotel Hosts and Hostesses. In the Magic Kingdom theme park, tips are accepted only for waitress service in restaurants.

### Your Departure

Our check-out time is noon. For assistance with your luggage, touch "2" on your telephone prior to stopping at the Cashier's desk. Because accommodations are limited, please call the Reception Desk at extension 3446 between 8 and 8:30 a.m. for information on additional nights' lodging.

### Credit

For charges incurred during your visit, we accept only Master Charge credit cards, personal checks, traveler's checks or cash.

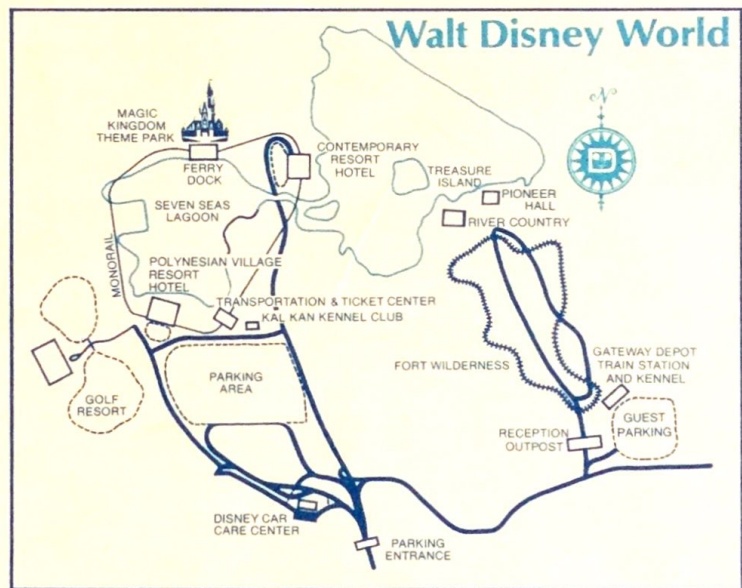
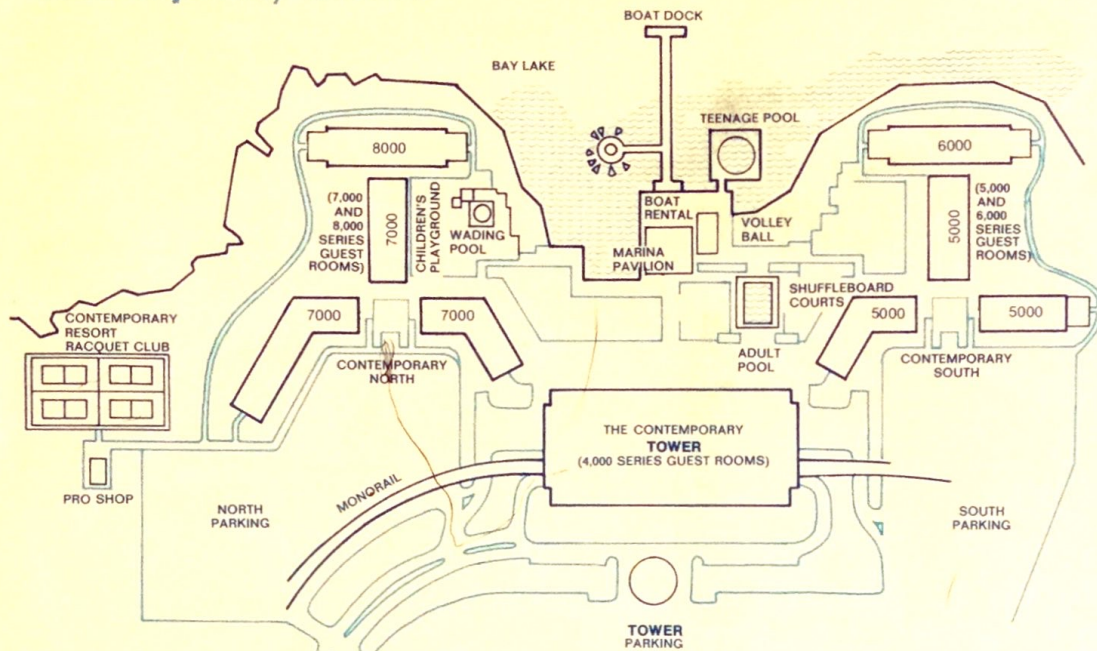

Second digit indicates floor number. (8223) (5102)

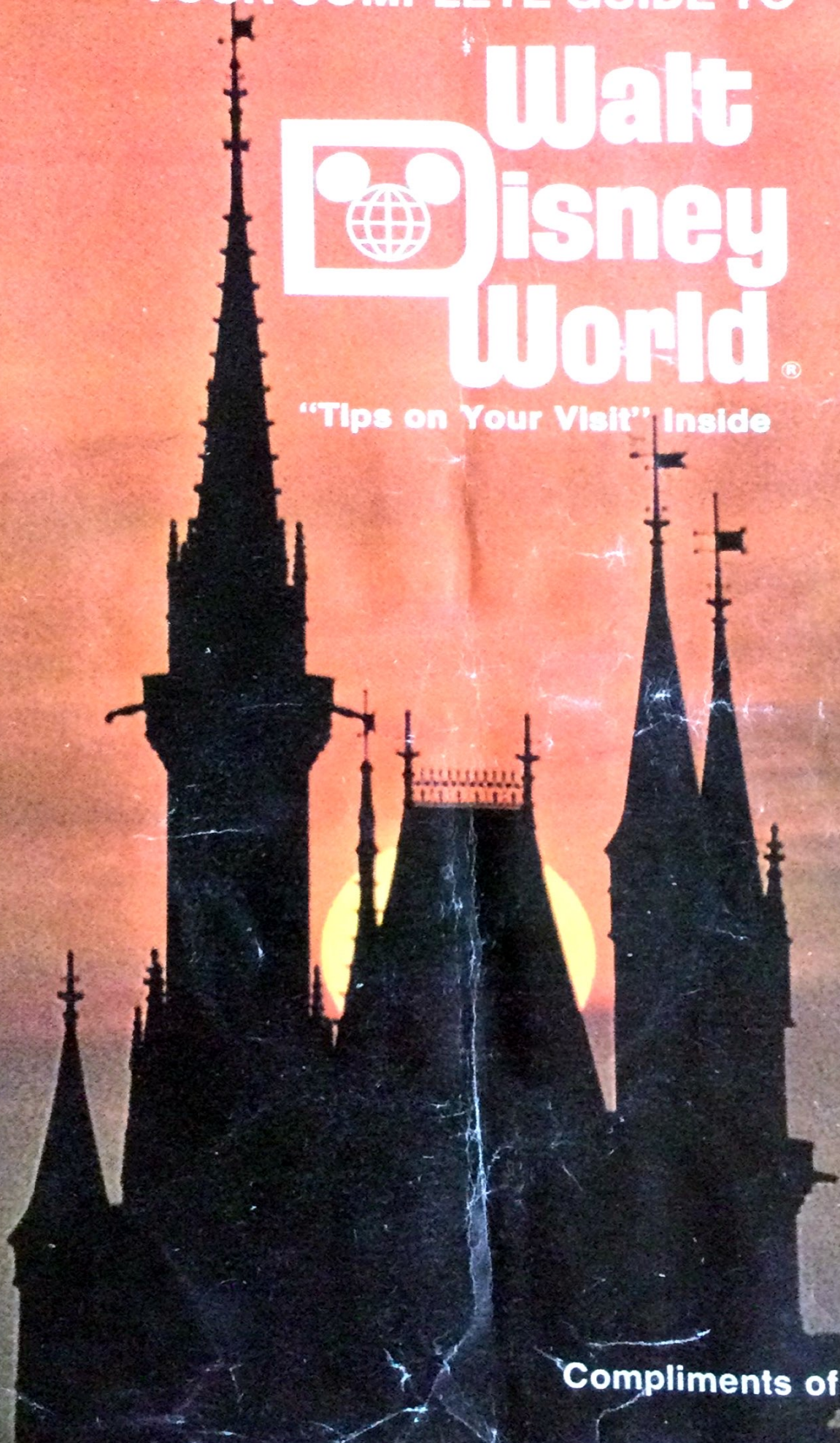

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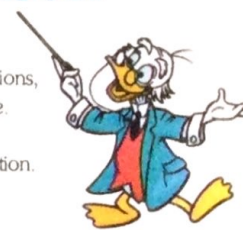

If you wish to leave the Magic Kingdom and return later the same day at no extra charge, please have your hand stamped at the exit gate as you leave.

Two locations: (1) Next to the Crystal Palace on Main Street (2) At the Transportation and Ticket Center. Registered nurses on duty.

### Baby Change Center

Located next to the Crystal Palace on Main Street. Facilities for changing infants, preparing formulas and warming bottles. Sorry, baby-sitting not available inside the Magic Kingdom.

### Tickets — Magic Kingdom

All guests may purchase ticket books at the Transportation and Ticket Center. Walt Disney World resort guests — at the Magic Kingdom, Fort Wilderness, or the resort hotels; Lake Buena Vista guests — at their respective ticket locations. (General Admission not available at Lake Buena Vista.)

## Attractions:

Let the descriptions listed on pages 5-13 help you decide which attractions you want to see. Locate and check these on the accompanying map, then follow the checked attractions around the Magic Kingdom. We suggest you begin in Tomorrowland on your first visit and in Adventureland on your second. Your Magic Kingdom ticket books will enable you to see many varied attractions. And, for your convenience, individual attraction coupons also may be purchased at ticket booths noted on map.

## Dining:

Hungry? There are a variety of restaurants and snack centers within seconds of your Magic Kingdom location. To save time, we suggest you **stop for lunch either before noon or after 2 p.m.** Then sample one of our other restaurants for a relaxing dinner before you leave this evening. All dining facilities, indicated in **red** on the accompanying map, are described under their respective lands on pages 5-13.

## Shopping:

You'll find everything from Disney souvenirs to antiques. We suggest you shop in early or mid-afternoon, then check your purchases in the Main Street railroad locker station and avoid the hectic pace of "late-exit shopping." Shops, noted in **orange** on the accompanying map, are described under their respective lands on pages 5-13.

### Walt Disney World Transportation

Walt Disney World ferryboats are the easiest means of transportation for guests in wheelchairs. Guests may also ride the Walt Disney World monorails; however, it is NOT possible for wheelchair guests to board or leave the monorail at the Contemporary Resort Hotel. Hotel shuttle bus service and motor launch service are available to the Contemporary Resort Hotel.

### Visiting Magic Kingdom Attractions

If a guest in a wheelchair is a small child or is partially mobile, he or she may be lifted from the wheelchair by parents or other responsible companions into and out of the following attractions. Guests may remain in their wheelchairs at all times in those attractions marked with an asterisk (\*).

### Helpful Information

**Parking Facilities** — Special parking is provided for guests in wheelchairs in the Medical Parking Lot, adjacent to the Transportation and Ticket Center. Inquire at the Auto Toll Plaza.

**Wheelchair Rental** — Wheelchairs may be rented for \$1 per day at the Stroller Shop, located just inside the Magic Kingdom Main Entrance. Guests also may bring their own wheelchairs.

**Wheelchair Ramps** — Wheelchair ramps are located at each street corner throughout Main Street, U.S.A.

**Telephones** — Special telephone facilities, placed within easy reach of guests in wheelchairs, are located beneath the Main Street Train Station and at the Transportation and Ticket Center.

**First-aid Station** — A first-aid station, staffed by a registered nurse, is located within the Magic Kingdom. The station is just off Main Street, U.S.A., beside the Crystal Palace.

# GAF Photo Tips

## I. Before You Start Shooting Check Your Equipment

### Camera:

**Is it clean?** Check for dirt and old film particles inside . . . fingerprints, water marks on lens outside.

**Functioning properly?** Check film advance, shutter, other mechanical features.

**Batteries fresh?** Keep an extra set handy. Clean contact points with rough cloth or eraser.

**THE GAF SERVICE COUNTER**, located in the **CAMERA CENTER** on Main Street, U.S.A., will be happy to assist you with your film and camera problems.

### Film:

**Check the size:** Do you want color or black & white? Prints or slides? Indoor film (tungsten) or outdoor?

**Is film fresh?** Film characteristics change with age and heat. Use before expiration date. **Important:** Never store film in a hot area such as a car trunk, glove compartment, or in direct sunlight.

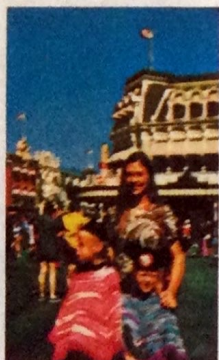
**Film in camera?** Some people actually forget to load up. When you do load your camera, stay away from intense sunlight if possible.

## II. While You Shoot . . . Keep These Things In Mind:

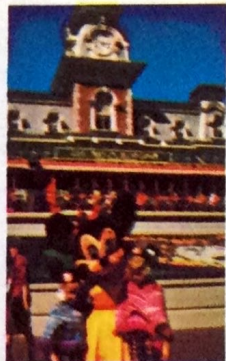
### Hold that camera steady!

Camera movement ruins more pictures than any other single factor. The **slower** your shutter speed, the **steadier** the camera must be.



### Watch the focus.

If your camera has a non-adjustable lens, stay at least **four feet** from your subject or it will appear fuzzy . . . "out of focus."

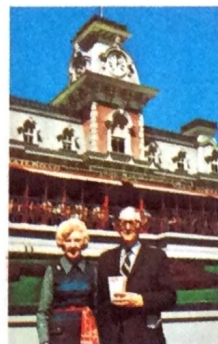


### Don't block the lens.

Lens caps, thumbs, camera cases, and other objects spoil a surprising number of pictures.

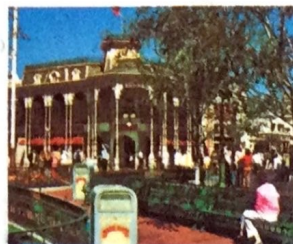
## III. Compose Those Pictures!

Outstanding pictures don't just happen . . . they are planned. Good composition is neither difficult nor time-consuming. It is fun, though, and it will improve your pictures dramatically.



### Let the surroundings tell a story

The first picture could have been shot anywhere including the backyard at home. The second picture, taken in the same area, captures the old-fashioned atmosphere of Main Street, U.S.A.



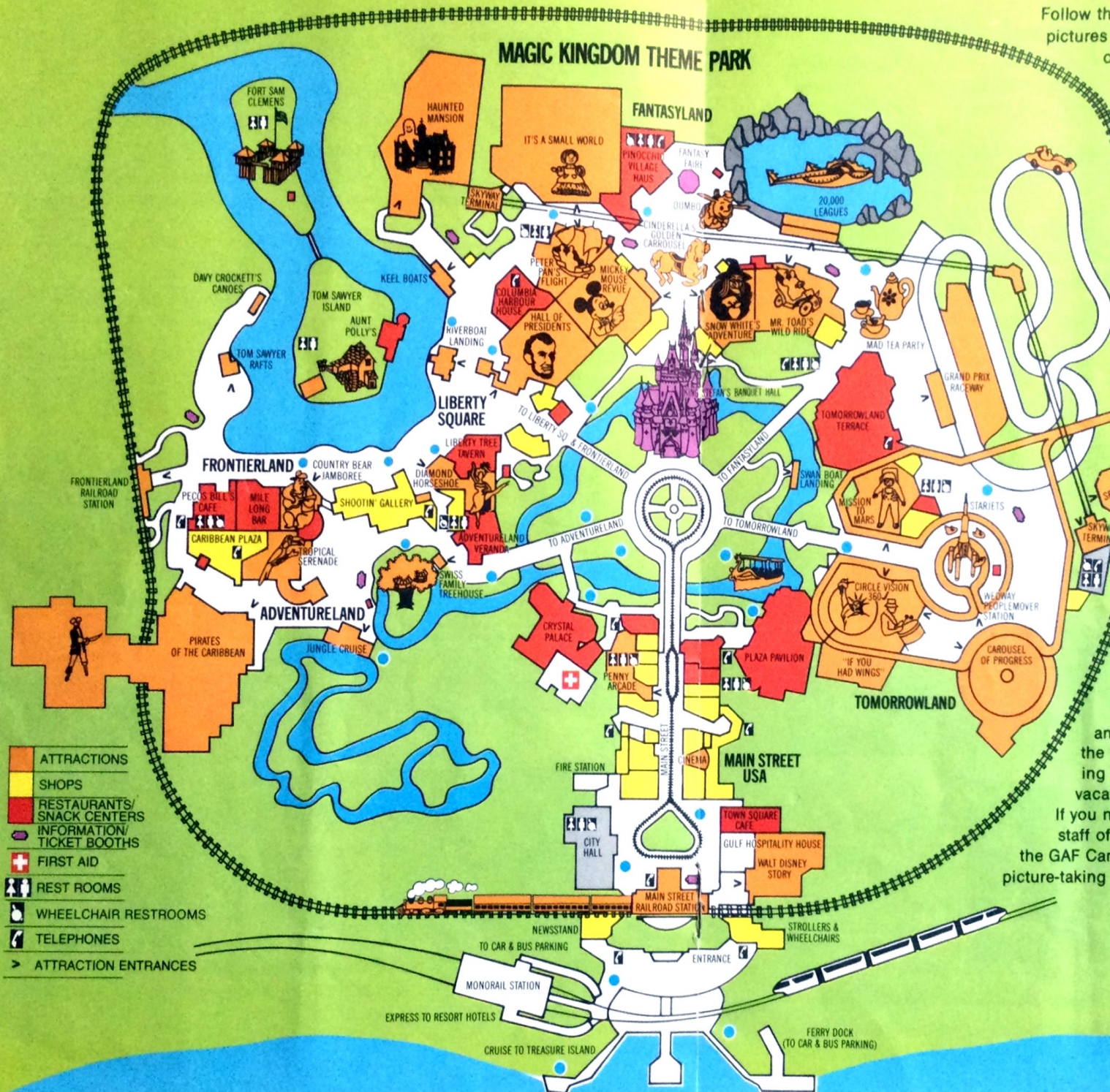
### Watch for unwanted objects

Avoid distracting objects such as trash cans and keep background objects such as trees from "growing" out of people's heads. Also avoid "cutting the subject in two" with your picture frame.

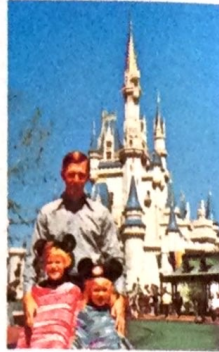

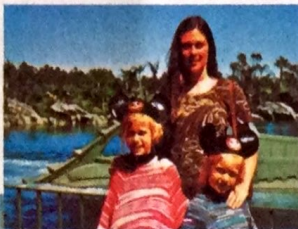
### Distance to subject

Bringing the family closer to the camera makes them recognizable yet retains the entire castle in the background.



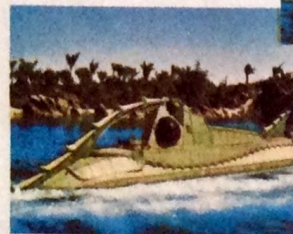
### Action shots better than posed

The thrill of the "Mad Tea Party" and the couple's reaction is a far more exciting picture than a stiff, posed scene.



### Some pictures don't need the family

Family pictures are important but a few go a long way. The same picture without the family clearly shows the submarine they just cruised on . . . better for storytelling back home.



## Extra pointers for movie fans

**Pan slowly.** Panning . . . moving your camera across a large area to show its entirety . . . is the biggest problem in home movies. Avoid a continuous blur by panning slowly . . . or avoid panning unless it's necessary.

**Zoom Springly.** Using a zoom lens on every shot will give you a "seasick" audience. A few zooms per roll are plenty. **NEVER ZOOM AND PAN AT THE SAME TIME!**

**Wind motor after each scene.** This way you'll never "run out of gas" in the middle of exciting action. If your camera has an electric drive, use fresh batteries.

**Vary scene length.** It will give your show a change of pace.

**Important!** . . . Don't try to film the entire Jungle Cruise, for example, on a few seconds of film. Remember that a minimum of **five full seconds** is normally required for any movie scene to be enjoyed and understood.

### An Important Word About Flashbulbs

Flash photography is not permitted in most indoor attractions in the Magic Kingdom. Because of the distance between the audience and the "show" in the Haunted Mansion, Hall of Presidents, Mickey Mouse Revue, Country Bear Jamboree, and other dimly lit attractions, any flash pictures taken will not reproduce.

Don't try to illuminate large subjects or anything further than 12 feet away. Large or distant objects at night must be shot with time exposure. A flash picture of the Cinderella Castle would require more than 100,000 flashbulbs!

Do follow the instructions of your flash equipment to the letter. It will save you time, money, and countless bad pictures.

## IV. When You Get Back Home:

**Develop your film immediately.** Remember that film characteristics change with age. The sooner you process the pictures, the sooner you will enjoy them, and the better they will be.

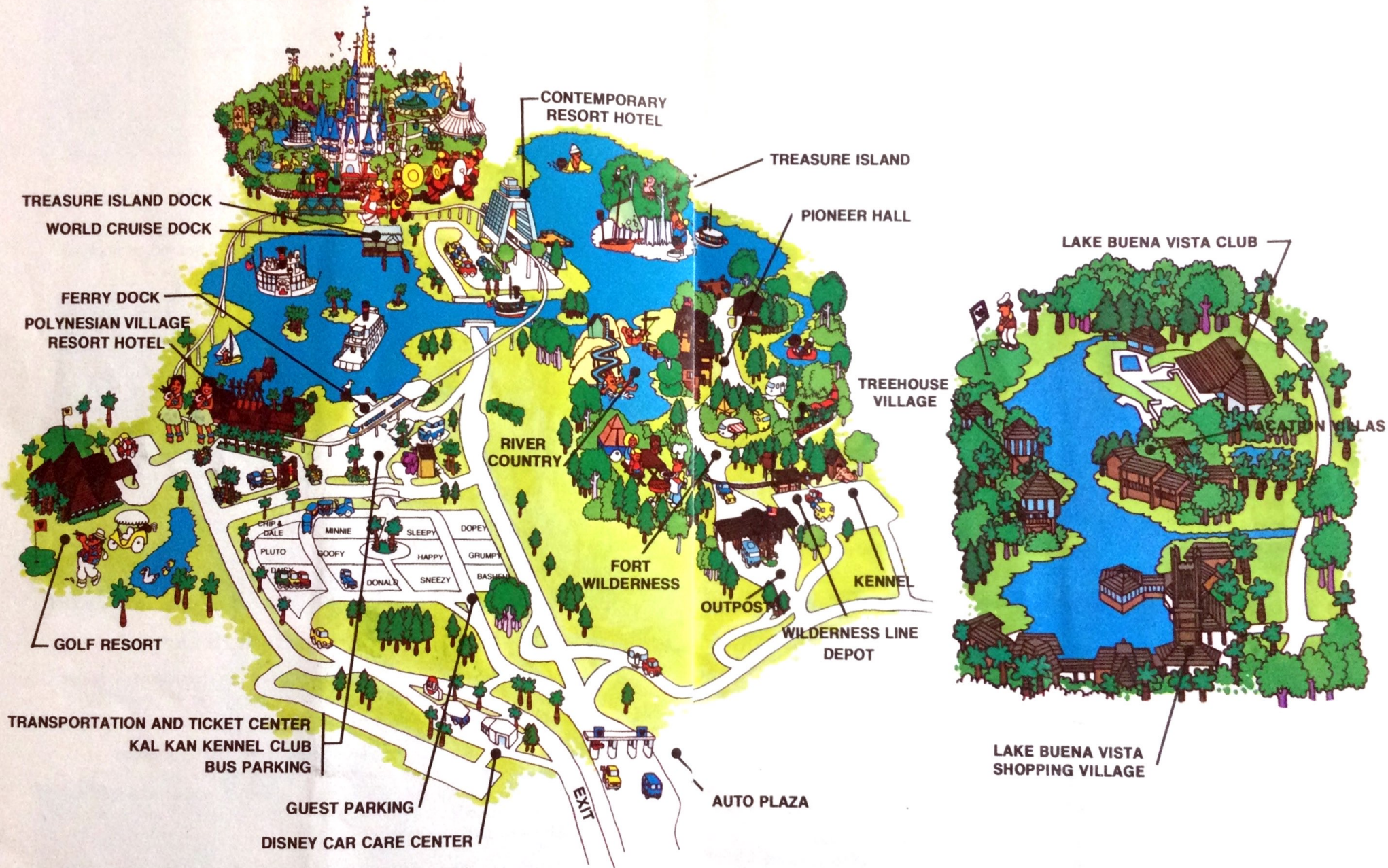
**Organize your "show."** Both slides and movies should be arranged according to subject . . . Adventureland, Fantasyland, Polynesian Village Hotel, etc. For example, even if you visited Adventureland several different times during a week's vacation, keep the pictures together. Your "show" will be much more understandable.

**Avoid repetition.** Fifteen different shots of the Cinderella Castle are fine for a "castle picture collection," but pick out only the cream of the crop for your show. The same goes for family pictures. Include several to show that you were "really there," but save the majority for the family album.

# River Country Has Slides, Raft Rides, Rope Swings

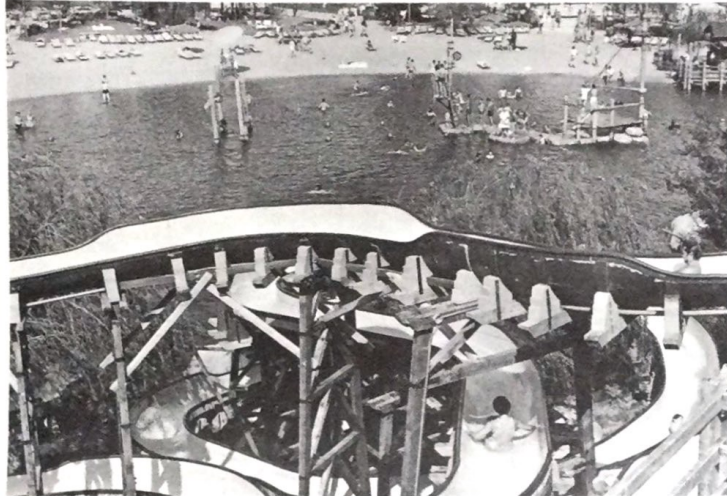
FORT WILDERNESS — Plunging into the Ol' Swimmin' Hole or gliding down a 260-foot, 2,000 gallon-a-minute water slide, called Whoop-N Holler Hollow, are among many of the exciting adventures in River Country, Walt Disney World's newest attraction.

The single-admission water playground located in Fort Wilderness consists of a swimming cove, pool, picnic area and nature trail, offering something special for every member of the family.

Cut from the sandy shores of Bay Lake, the 175-foot-wide swimming cove and its waters are necklaced by golden beaches, ideal for toasting to a deep tan in Florida's almost ever-present sunshine. Spreading, moss-draped cypress trees and picturesque rock formations surround the entire attraction.

Some of the fun at River Country includes sailing through the air from a series of rope swings, piloting a raft down winding rapids and under sparkling waterfalls at Raft Rider Ridge, and falling seven feet through mid-air into the swimming pool at Slippery Slide Falls.

Around the bend of the one-acre cove are more slides for younger folks

at the Ol' Wading Pool, divided from the main swimming area by a barrel bridge.

Adjacent to the cove is a 160-foot-long, heated swimming pool, called The Upstream Plunge. Complete with diving

platforms and sculpted rock landscaping, it provides hours of water fun in a pleasant, down-home setting.

Pop's Picnic Willow, overlooking both swimming areas, has picnic tables, and stretches of lush grass where roam-

ing peacocks occasionally can be seen. Nearby, a stream-fed wading pond cools toddlers with surprise squirts from built-in sprinklers.

Near the shady areas of Pop's Picnic Willow is Pop's Place, which offers a selection of snacks and refreshments. Pop's Place shares a rustic decor with all the other sections of Fort Wilderness — the campgrounds, Pioneer Hall dinner theater, the Petting Farm and recreation areas.

For a relaxing view of the quiet Florida woodland, guests can stroll along the Cypress Point Trail, an elevated boardwalk that winds a half-mile around the shoreline of Bay Lake.

River Country is open daily from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m.. A bathhouse, complete with shower and locker facilities, is available for all.

The water playground is easily accessible by boat or motor coach from the Magic Kingdom and resorts. Parking also is available at the Fort Wilderness Reception Outpost area, with transportation to River Country provided by authentic, 19th-century steam trains.

Gang Plank Walk, an elevated boardwalk, winds throughout the aviary for a superb view of the habitat.

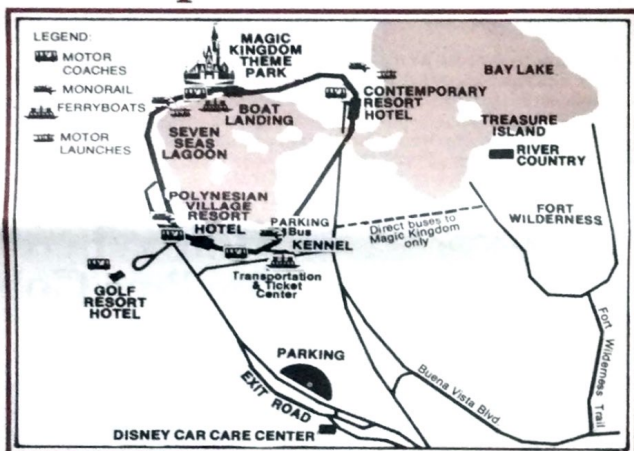

## Green Monsters, Birdies Await Golfers

Three "green monsters," a nest of "birdies" and everything in-between might be the best description of Walt Disney World's three championship 18-hole golf courses.

Designed by noted architect, Joe Lee, the Palm, Magnolia and Lake Buena Vista courses each bear his distinctive trademarks.

There are "green monster" holes with sand traps and water hazards ready to snare even the pros who will compete in the annual Walt Disney World

Golf Classic National Team Championship, November 4-7. This year's tournament, which follows a best-ball format, will award \$200,000 in prize money to top professionals playing in the contest.

The Palm and the Magnolia, host courses for the PGA event, are part of the Walt Disney World Golf Resort. Complete with driving ranges, putting greens, lighted tennis courts, a pro shop, dining room, lounge, and pool, this 151-room luxury resort is a total recreational oasis.

Just moments from the guest rooms is the first tee of the 6,951-yard Palm course which has been named one of the "Top 100 tests of golf in America" by *Golf Digest*.

The number six hole is perhaps the "monster" on the Palm. As a par four, it carries the number one handicap. The tee shot is the key to par, forcing a long drive over water to set up for the approach. To the left is more water, and to the right, a dense stand of trees and undergrowth.

The second shot also must carry over water to a testy elevated green. More forest on the right calls for a precise hit to achieve par.

Alongside the Palm is the 7,222-yard Magnolia, which hosts the final rounds of the Walt Disney World Golf Classic. Its elevated tees and greens contribute to the hazards of sand and water that are a must on any flat Florida course.

But the Magnolia's most awesome "monster" is number 17, probably the toughest hole of all the Walt Disney World courses.

This par four beauty has frustrated scores of pros and amateurs alike. The

tee shot, past water on the left and a virtual jungle on the right, must be a long straight ball. This allows the golfer to bite off as much as he wishes. It's also the key to par, keeping in mind that the ball should land as close to the water as possible. This sets up for the second shot to the left — onto a green guarded by more water and traps.

Located about 15 minutes from the Palm and Magnolia, the Lake Buena Vista course is slightly shorter and more secluded than its fellow courses.

Lake Buena Vista's toughest hole is number eight, a 504-yard par five. The hole is extremely tight, and the tee shot is bunkered to the left. The second shot is a dog-leg left and also is bunkered on the left, with deep woods on the right. Then, the approach shot is 90 yards to an elevated green guarded by three sand traps.

Complementing the Lake Buena Vista course is the Lake Buena Vista Club, the center of recreation in the Host Community.

Besides the golf course, the Club features two putting greens, two driving ranges, tennis courts, group activity rooms, a pool, pro shop, lounge and dining room.

The charge for each of the three Walt Disney World courses is \$10 for greens fee and \$5 for the required electric golf cart. After 4 p.m., a special "Twilighter Rate" goes into effect: \$7.50 for greens fee and golf cart. Clubs and shoes may be rented at the pro shops. For tee-off times, call 824-2200.

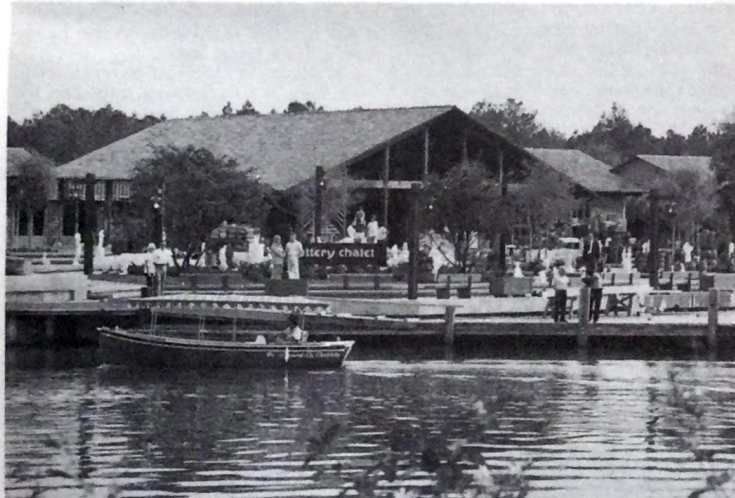

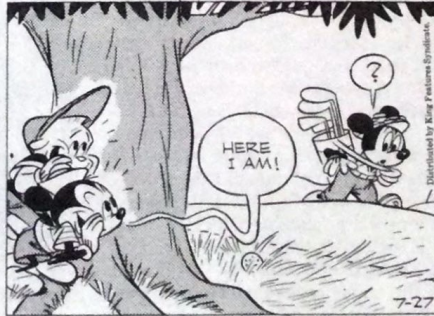

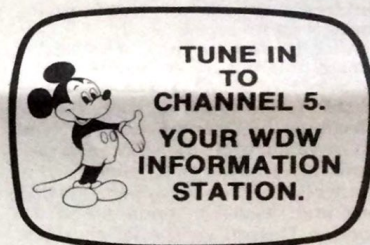

**MAGIC KINGDOM** — King Stefan's Banquet Hall on the second floor of the Cinderella Castle offers one of the most unusual family dining experiences in the Magic Kingdom.

With standing suits of armor, a huge 25-branched candelabra hung from a 50-foot, peaked ceiling, Gothic arches and stained glass windows, the restaurant is permeated with a medieval atmosphere.

Massive ceiling beams, intricately carved moldings, and colorful banners made of rich velvets and silks add to the "days of Camelot" feeling. Genuine antiques and authentic replicas of medieval cooking utensils and other furnishings are situated throughout the dining room.

King Stefan's Banquet Hall features a unique dining procedure. Guests choose their "fit for a king" entree from menus posted in the ground-level foyer, and pay for their entire meal at the same time. This eliminates ordering time and the sound of cash registers in the upstairs dining room. The result is a gracious, leisurely atmosphere, with only the pleasant sound of harpsichord and flute madrigals filling the air.

There are separate luncheon and dinner menus. Both feature beef, chicken and seafood dishes, including Roast Prime Rib of Beef, Broiled Florida Red Snapper and Poulet Louise (Portions of tender chicken dipped in egg batter and fried to a golden brown).

The entree price includes an appetizer, dessert and beverage. Salad Chiffonade, an appetizer made with a combination of tomatoes, string beans, cucumbers, salami strips, and bits of bacon, served on chilled lettuce with a dressing, is one of the house specialties.

The dessert served is Her Majesty's Favorite: Crepe Angelica. "This is one of the most requested recipes," says Susan Etnyre, restaurant supervisor.

"Crepe Angelica is made with a thin French pancake, whipped cream, coconut, pineapple flavoring, and a strawberry-melba fruit topping."

Guests enter the second floor restaurant by either an elevator or a wide, spiraling, 41-step staircase. The main floor of the dining room is octagonal, surrounded by spacious archways. Off to the side of the main dining floor, natural light-flooded alcoves give guests an overview of Fantasyland, and an especially impressive aerial view of Cinderella's Golden Carrousel.

King Stefan's Banquet Hall is named for the father of Sleeping Beauty in the Walt Disney film production of Sleeping Beauty. In all the Disney films, King Stefan was the only king to ever have a name.

The banquet hall is open for lunch and dinner from 11 a.m. till 6 p.m., Saturday through Wednesday during the fall. Guests can make reservations at the foyer entrance anytime during the day. No phone call reservations are accepted, and the dress is casual.

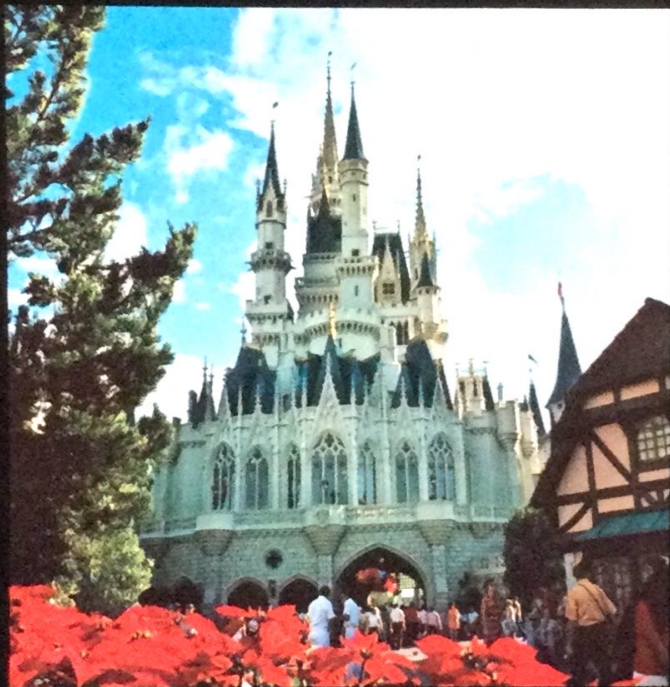

Your true test of courage comes later when you unsuspectingly sail amidst swashbuckling pirates rampaging the coastal Caribbean towns. Slipping by them in the night shadows, you see more "Pirates of the Caribbean" raucously rejoicing their plunders.

## Frontierland

A few steps further and you realize that you have crossed the border into the Old West just in time for what must be a celebration. Steamboat whistles, banjo strumming, and the country tunes of the "Sandy Valley Boys" are greeting all Frontierland newcomers. 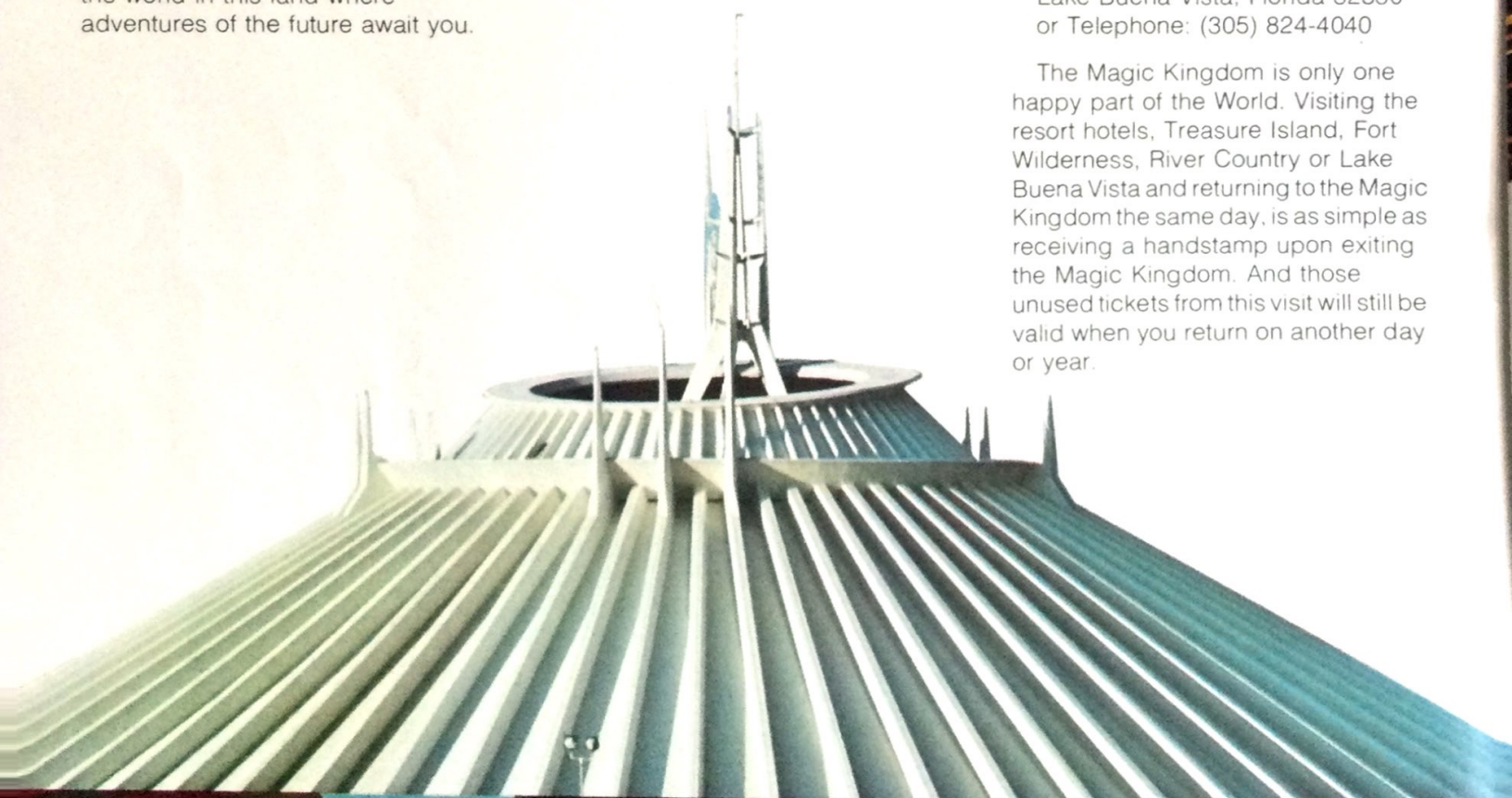

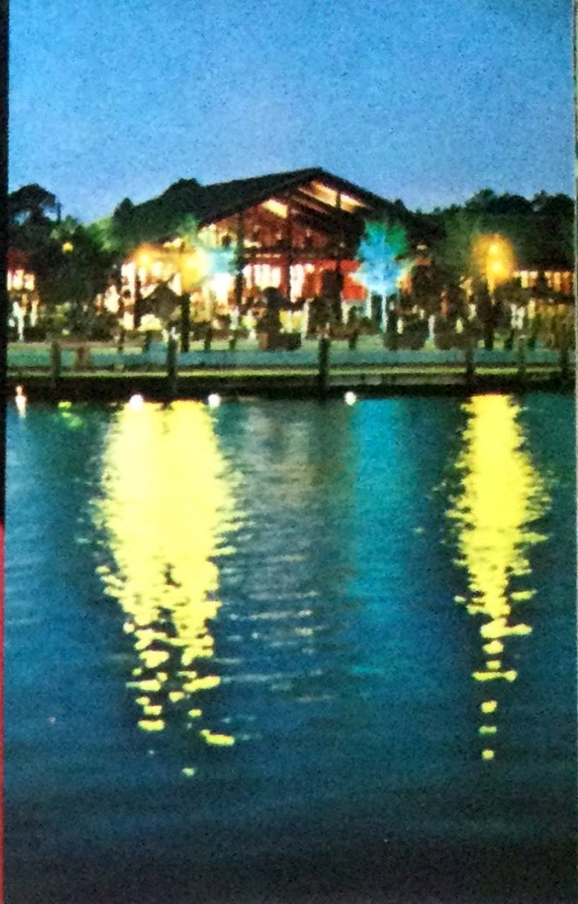

The Grand Canyon Concourse, 150 feet longer than a football field, is dominated by a 90-foot, floor-to-ceiling ceramic mural which gives the concourse its name. Containing 18,000 separate hand-painted, fire-glazed ceramic tiles, the mural is six-sided and fully visible to guests dining in the restaurants of the Grand Canyon Terrace or browsing in the boutiques which line the concourse.

Located along the sloping walls of the Tower and in two garden wings called the Contemporary North and the Contemporary South, the guest rooms of the resort are spacious, ultra-modern in decor, and feature unobstructed views of the Vacation Kingdom.

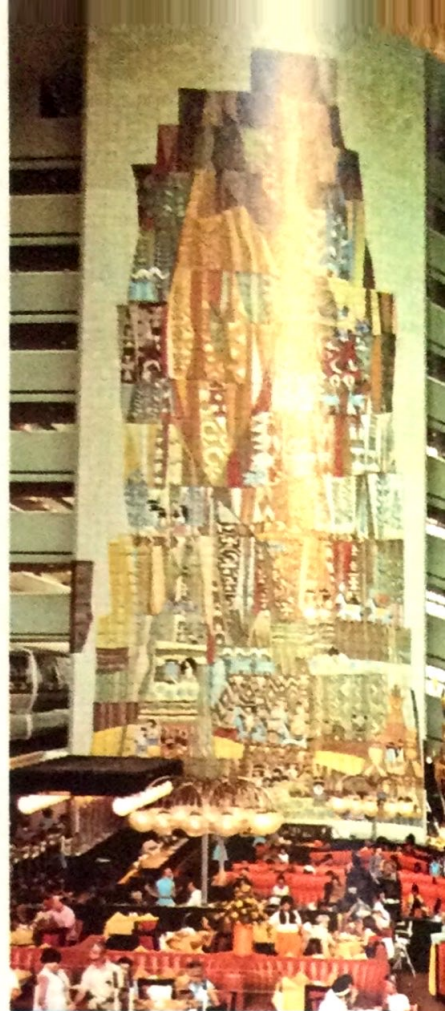

The Gulf Coast Room on the second floor of the Tower has an intimate candlelight atmosphere, complete with strolling musicians, and entrees presented flambe at your table.

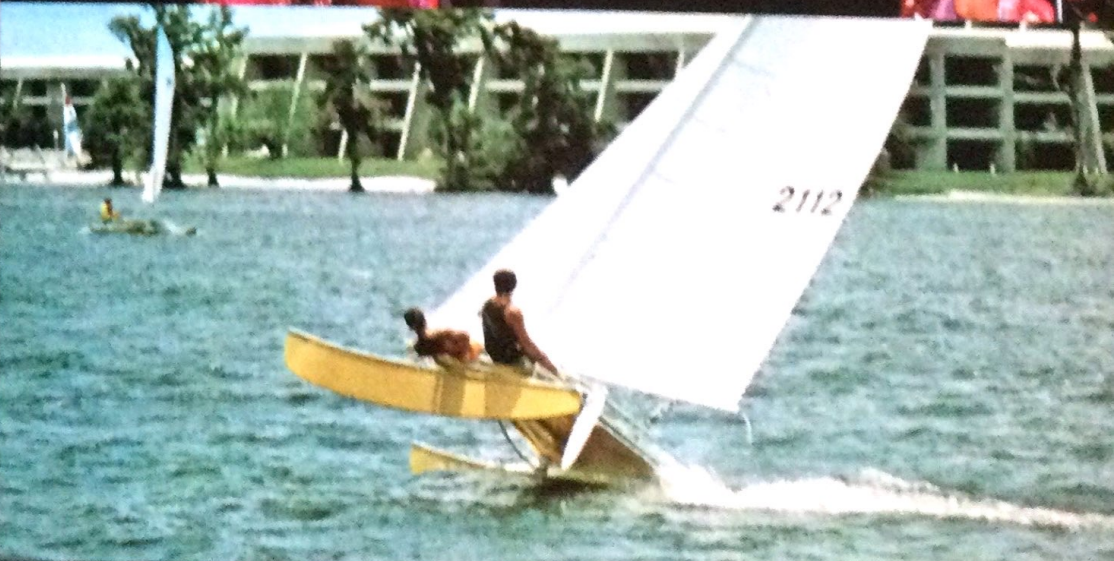

The Contemporary Resort is the complete retreat for your vacationing family with the rest of the "World" only minutes away by monorail or motor coach.



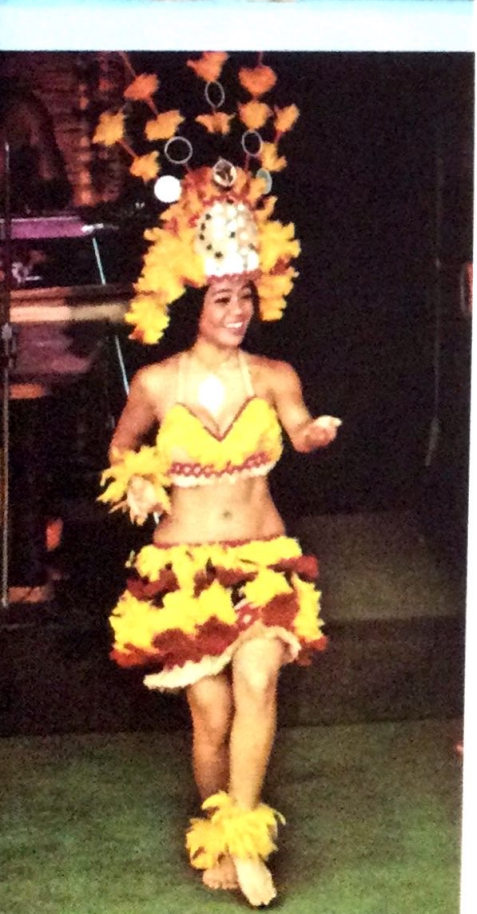












## Polynesian Village Resort Hotel

## Fort Wilderness

There is more than just camping at Walt Disney World's Fort Wilderness. You can spend an unforgettable vacation swimming in clear lakes, sunning on sandy beaches, sailing a fleet of boats, traveling on an authentic steam locomotive, or exploring the Magic Kingdom theme park.

Located on the south shore of sparkling clear Bay Lake, just beyond the Magic Kingdom, Fort Wilderness, a 600-acre natural retreat, presently has over 800 campsites.

Centuries-old cypress trees stand beside tall pines and flowering bay trees, screening the secluded sites, each of which is provided with water, a 110-volt electrical outlet, a sanitary disposal system, a charcoal fireplace, and a picnic table. Air-conditioned comfort stations, conveniently situated near all the campsites, have private showers, ice dispensers, laundry facilities, restrooms and public telephones.

The Settlement Trading Post and the Meadow Trading Post, old-fashioned country stores, carry complete lines of camping supplies along with delicatessen sandwiches, box lunches, beverages, sport clothes and basic grocery items.

To get an overview of Fort Wilderness, you may board a 19th-century steam locomotive at the depot near the Outpost entrance or near the Settlement Trading Post. Chugging along at 6-10 miles per hour, the train carries passengers over more than three miles of narrow-gauge track which winds through primitive woodland, past fishing holes and over wooden bridges.

Recreational activities abound within the realms of the wooded wilderness area where burly loggers once set up their base camp. To allow you to take a better look at Florida's abundant wildlife and natural beauty, bicycles and canoes both may be rented at the campground's Bike Barn.

If hiking is your hobby, a combination boardwalk and footpath can lead you through a subtropical forest of singing birds and fluttering butterflies for hours of enjoyment.

White, sandy beaches near the Settlement Trading Post entice you to join in the water fun, and a variety of watercraft, including sailboats, Aqua Larks (mini-speedboats built for two), Bob-A-Rounds (electrically powered) and Pedal Boats may be rented for exploring Bay Lake and the Seven Seas Lagoon.

You may also rent a boat, driver and equipment for skiing on the 650-acres of crystal clear water, or rent a canoe and silently paddle through a maze of tree-lined canals. Other launches regularly leave the Fort Wilderness dock transporting you to the Magic Kingdom, the Contemporary Resort Hotel and the Polynesian Village Resort Hotel.

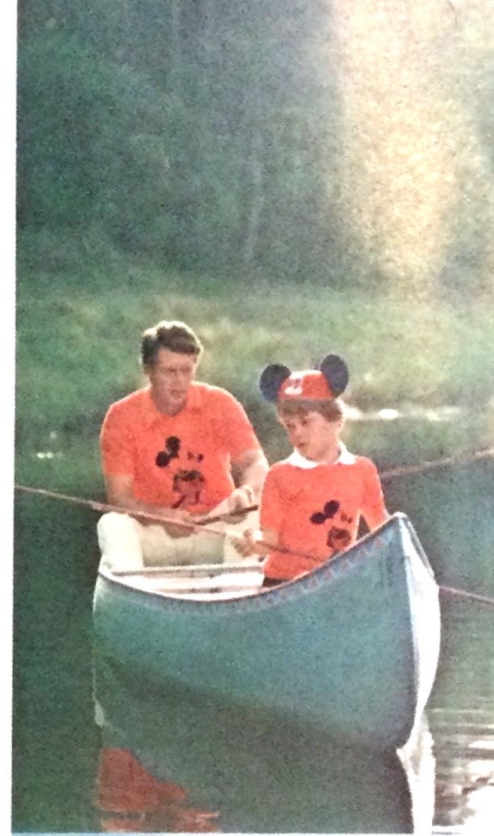
Volleyball, tetherball, horseshoes, badminton, softball and fishing in a stocked stream are some of the other recreational activities you may enjoy at the campground.

The Fort Apache Playground, with jungle-gyms, slides and look-out posts themed to the days of the pioneers, is a play area that amuses younger children for hours.

As evening falls at Fort Wilderness, you can gather around a blazing campfire at Marshmallow Marsh, and join in a boisterous sing-along while roasting marshmallows to a golden brown.

Other nighttime happenings at Fort Wilderness vary from the Meadow Trading Post campfire programs with movies and surprise visits from Disney characters, to the rip-roaring "Hoop-Dee-Doo" dinner show at Pioneer Hall where you can relive the charm and excitement of the Old West. Beneath rough-hewn rafters and hanging lanterns, you can chow down on home-cooked vittles like fried chicken, barbecued ribs, baked beans and, of course, hot apple pie, all served by the singing hosts of the "Hoop-Dee-Doo Musical Revue."

Fort Wilderness, with its abundant wildlife and plant life, its many attractions and its numerous recreational activities, is a vacation world in itself.











## Today the World has a New Country

An exciting new country now awaits you inside Walt Disney World's Fort Wilderness. River Country is a re-creation of summertime shenanigans in the water, offering rollicking, old-fashioned, good, clean, American fun the year-round.

The novel, single-admission attraction is a Disney-style "Ol' Swimmin' Hole," complete with the trimmings. Incorporating all the originality of Disney Imagineering, River Country is the kersplashingest, kid-laughingest, raft-ridingest, rope-swingingest spot imaginable for the wet set.

At River Country's combination cove, pool and picnic areas, you can splash, ride, and glide down a twisting, 260-foot, flume-style slide at "Whoop-N-Holler Hollow," pilot a raft down winding rapids and under sparkling waterfalls, swan dive from both high and low diving platforms, and cannonball from a series of swaying rope swings.

Cut from the sandy shores of Bay Lake, the 600-foot-wide swimming cove and its clear waters are necklaced by golden beaches, ideal for toasting to a glowing tan in Florida's almost ever-present sunshine. Spreading, moss-draped cypress trees and picturesque rock formations surround the entire attraction, making it just the place for a lazy day of sunning and swimming.

Older children and adults may enjoy the deeper end of the Ol' Swimmin' Hole, while younger bathers will find a safe, shallow section set off especially for them by an old-fashioned floating bridge.

Adjacent to the cove is a 160-foot-long, heated (in winter) swimming pool, complete with diving platforms, slides, and sculpted rock landscaping, to provide hours of water fun in a pleasant, down-home setting.

And since no day in the country would be complete without Mom's fried chicken and Grandma's homemade baked beans, complete picnic facilities (including charcoal grills) are provided. "Pops Picnic

Willow," which overlooks both swimming areas, also has a stream-fed wading pool that cools tiny tots with periodic squirts from built-in sprinklers.

Nearby, "Pop's Place" offers guests a selection of groceries, snacks, and sundries, and the adjoining bathhouse supplies complimentary-use beach towels as well as complete shower and locker facilities.

This time-of-your-life attraction, located west of Pioneer Hall in Fort Wilderness, is easily accessible by boat or motor coach from the Magic Kingdom and the resort hotels. Guests staying at or driving to the campground can take the Fort Wilderness Line Railroad to within a short walking distance of River Country.

Walt Disney World's newest country is a great place to enjoy the good old summertime, all year long.

Bring a swimsuit and a smile. You're likely to wear out both, at River Country.





## Lake Buena Vista

Situated in a peaceful, pine woods and water-entwined corner of Disney's 43-square-mile Vacation Kingdom in Florida is Lake Buena Vista, the Host Community to Walt Disney World. Just off Interstate 4 and State Road 535, this nature-inspired city provides the ultimate in vacation lifestyles.

Accommodations range from four high-rise hotels to unique Vacation Villas and towering Treehouses. The Lake Buena Vista Club, with its 18-hole, championship golf course, tennis courts, swimming pool, and gourmet dining room, is the center for recreation and relaxation in the Host Community. The new Lake Buena Vista Shopping Village has something for every member of the family among its 29 cedar-shingled shops and four distinctive restaurants clustered around a sparkling lagoon. And, most important of all, there's a Magic Kingdom in Lake Buena Vista's "backyard."

Along the tree- and flower-lined entrance road to the City of Lake Buena Vista are the four hotels of the Hotel Plaza. The Dutch Inn, Howard Johnson's, Royal Plaza and Travelodge reach above the tips of the evergreen trees, stretching towards the warm Florida sun.

Each hotel provides luxurious accommodations and all the "extras," including pools, shops, restaurants, lounges, meeting facilities and recreational activities. In addition, the hotels also offer you a unique selection of "Disney services."

You can enjoy the convenience of shuttle bus transportation to the Magic Kingdom (via a private road) approximately every 20 minutes. Each night, Walt Disney feature films, such as *Mary Poppins* and *Snow White & the Seven Dwarfs* are presented in one hotel at a nominal charge to all Lake Buena Vista guests. And every Sunday, you may attend church services held in one of the hotels.

On the edge of the Hotel Plaza, just a short, peaceful stroll away, lies the Lake Buena Vista Shopping Village. Quite unlike the usual shopping center, the Lake Buena Vista Shopping Village displays its wares in



individual, picturesque shops which encourage photography and leisurely browsing.

Within the weathered-brick and cedar-shingled buildings, you may watch glass cutters etch ships on carafes, potters shape clay into works of art, and candy-makers twist sweet lollipops as youngsters gaze with their noses pressed against the windows.

## EPCOT: A Future World Planned for Today

Walt Disney World is dedicated not only to how people play, but also to how they live and work. As a part of its development, Walt Disney envisioned a city . . . a world of the future planned as an example for today's world.

Central to these plans is the community Walt Disney called EPCOT—Experimental Prototype Community of Tomorrow — “where people actually live a life they can’t find anywhere else in the world today.”

Phase I of EPCOT, the Vacation Kingdom and the Magic Kingdom theme park, is already a reality.

Now, Walt Disney Productions has announced plans for Phase II of EPCOT, which will include the “World Showcase,” an international exposition, “International Village,” where representatives from the various countries which participate in the World Showcase will reside, and the EPCOT “Future World Theme Center,” a central core or plaza where guests will be introduced to the multiple ideas and concepts of EPCOT.

World Showcase, a permanent international exposition in which many nations will participate by showing

their national cultures and products, will be the first development in this second phase of Walt Disney World's continuing growth.

From 10 to 30 nations may occupy the pavilions in the World Showcase's two facing semi-circular buildings. Visits to the pavilions will be like brief trips to the different countries; the people, the cultures, and the national wares all will be authentic. Against scenic landscaping, Disney-designed rides and attractions, cafes, shops and displays will portray the nations they represent.

Construction is scheduled to begin by late 1977 on a tract of Walt Disney World property between the present Transportation and Ticket Center and U.S. 192, so that the World Showcase will be complete by the 1980 target opening date.

The 200 or so people staffing each pavilion, many of them young men and women from the country represented, will be a key aspect of the World Showcase. They will live with representatives from other nations in the International Village which will be built near the World Showcase. A part of this “world community” also could be themed for public visits.

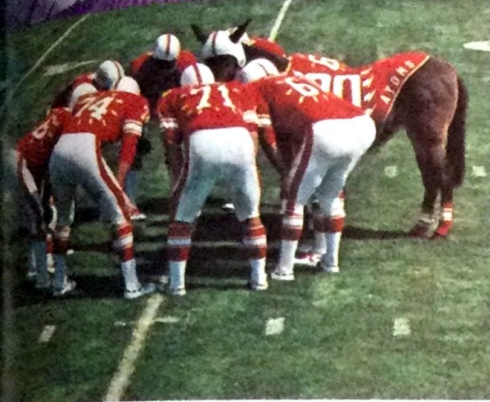
The EPCOT Future World Theme Center will be built in the middle of

the entire 43-square-mile EPCOT development. Surrounding the center will be a series of major satellites, each specializing in a different field. Potential satellites could relate to energy, agriculture, education, health and medicine, and communications. At each satellite, men and women of science and industry will work on new technology related to the “theme” of that area.

The heart of EPCOT will be this Future World Theme Center where a 360-degree movie screen and displays in its three major pavilions, Science and Technology, Community and Communications and the Arts, will offer guests an overview of the satellites' current projects. Then guests could visit the satellites they are interested in and see in-depth demonstrations.

“EPCOT will take its cue from the new ideas and new technologies that are now emerging from the creative centers of American industry,” said Disney. “It will be a community of tomorrow that will never be completed but always be introducing, testing and demonstrating new materials and new systems.”
