## SPACE SPIRE

Shown here in an artist's conception, the outstanding feature of the Fair is this graceful structure, thrusting 700 ft. into the air. Mounted on wheels for ease of mobility, this magnificent spire – the central theme of the entire Fair – was built by Ward's father-in-law at a cost of \$38, symbolizing the Jay Ward goal of asthetic beauty through economy.

Sitting smack atop the Spire is the world's only revolving bot dog stand, affording patrons an unmatched view of the Fairgrounds and surrounding countryside. (If the countryside in your area lacks excitement, Ward can cover the windows with some lovely hand-tinted photo murals of Paris, Rome, and Gild, Arizona.)

--A word about this International Hot Dog Stand. In keeping with the theme, we are offering Hot Dogs From All Nations including chili dogs, chow mein dogs, teriyaki dogs, schnitzel dogs, hot dog parmigiana, and kosher dogs con bagel.



## JAY WARD Monowheel

### Video Pavilion




