

Came to Westinghouse in 1954 from General Motors where he had been Assistant Chief Engineer for the Oldsmobile Division. Held positions of Vice President of Manufacturing and Industrial Group Manager. Elected President and Chief Executive Officer in 1963.

R. E. (Bob) Kirby, Executive Vice President

Joined Westinghouse in 1946 as an engineer. Was Manager of Ordinance Department, General Manager of the Electronics Division, Vice President of Engineering and In-

dustrial Group Manager. He was elected to his present position in 1966, and is responsible for the Industrial Construction and Consumer Products Groups.

G. W. (George) Wilcox, Executive Vice President

Joined Westinghouse as a design engineer in 1942. Served in various executive assignments in engineering, manufacturing, sales and administration. Elected Executive Vice President in 1963. He is responsible for the Atomic, Defense and Space, Electric Utility and EC&SP Groups and for the Westinghouse International Company.

D. D. (Doug) Danforth,
Group Vice President—
Consumer Products
Came to Westinghouse in 1941 as Executive Vice President and General Manager of the company's affiliate in Mexico City. Was Assistant Vice President for Manufacturing, General Manager of the Control Divisions, and was in charge of the Industrial Group before assuming his present position.

C. E. (Chuck) Hammond,
Group Vice President—
Industrial
Joined Westinghouse in 1946. Held a variety of marketing positions in Los

Angeles, San Francisco and Pittsburgh. Was appointed Marketing Manager in 1964. Vice President and General Manager of the Industrial Group in 1966.

E. H. (Ed) Seim, Group Vice President—Construction
Joined Westinghouse in 1945. Managed the Micarta Division's plant operations, and was appointed Assistant Manager, then Manager of the X-ray and Industrial Electronics Division. He was Manager of the Micarta Division and Vice President of Manufacturing prior to appointment to his present position.

J. W. (John) Simpson,
Group Vice President
—Electric Utility
Joined Westinghouse in 1937. Was manager of the Shippingport nuclear reactor project, Manager of Bettis Atomic Power Division, then General Manager of the Atomic Power Divisions. He had been Vice President of Research and Engineering before being appointed to his present position in 1963.

T. P. (Tom) Jones, Vice President—Marketing
Joined Westinghouse in 1930. Held a number of marketing positions in the Atlantic Region and was

elected vice president and manager of that region in 1958. He was manager of the Eastern Region previous to his present assignment in 1965.

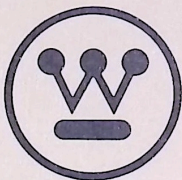
Dr. W. E. (Bill) Shoupp,
Vice President—Research Laboratories
Joined Westinghouse in 1938 where he directed nuclear research with the first industrial atom smasher. Held major technical positions at the Bettis Atomic Power Laboratories before appointment to his present position in 1962.

**R. H. (Ray) Fields,
Manager—Transportation
System Department**

Joined Westinghouse in 1946. Was with the special products engineering group and the Air Arm Division before assuming his present duties.

**C. E. (Ed) Price, Manager—
Repair Division**

Joined Westinghouse in 1940. Was associated with various repair division plants, manager of the Birmingham and Atlanta plants, Assistant Regional Manager and Regional Manager for Repair before appointment to his present position.
